The collection's eclectic cast of literary, fictional, and pop culture figures, including Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers, Anton Chekov, Robinson Crusoe, King Kong, Marilyn Monroe, and Ulysses, further blurs the line between what is real and what is illusory.
